

Dreaming Roots is a spectacular, inspiring performance journey by and about Yukon First Nations people, from long ago into the future. It weaves together new work from 50+ Yukon Indigenous artists in dance, music, drumming, theatre, storytelling and more, in traditional and contemporary forms. It also features stunning imagery, sound design, lighting, regalia, costumes, and props.

Dreaming Roots is directed by internationally acclaimed Indigenous artists Alejandro Ronceria and Diyet van Lieshout with a collaborative team, guided by knowledge keepers in a culturally grounded process.

"Dreaming Roots is about how we see ourselves in the present, how we connect with our past, and how we dream of our future as Yukon First Nations people. This show explores questions such as: Where do we come from? How do we connect to the source? How do we reconcile and heal? What are our hopes and dreams?"

## Adäka History

Adäka means "Coming into the Light" in the Southern Tutchone language. Since 2011, the Adäka Cultural Festival has brought Indigenous visual and performing artists from every Yukon community and from around the world to their performance stages and world-class art gallery — shining a bright light on our vibrant cultures.

The festival is the proud legacy of the Yukon First Nations 2010 project that saw over 50 Yukon First Nations artists travel to Vancouver for the Winter Olympics to celebrate Northern Indigenous traditional and contemporary arts. Beaders, sculptors, carvers, and painters along with dancers, drummers and singers move audiences.

They ignited a flame in our hearts to continue celebrating our talented artists at home with our people and with visitors to our land. That fire burns brighter with each festival as young and emerging artists join Elders and established artists exploring old themes and new, giving voice and vision to our northern homeland. From the beginning they have placed a high value on excellence in production values for our performers and exhibition facilities for our visual artists. The festival also serves as a cultural hub connecting all generations to preserve and pass on our languages, stories, music and artistic practices.



The impacts of these past two years have been felt all across the territory, let alone the world, and the Adäka Cultural Festival is back, providing some much-needed light this summer.



The 10th anniversary of Adäka features storytelling, cultural presentations, workshops, and more. We will celebrate artists from across Canada's North and other Circumpolar countries around the world.

Impressive performances will be held on the Longhouse Main Stage and on the Taga Shäw Riverside Stage overlooking the Yukon River. Adäka's galleries will be full of jaw-dropping artwork where guests can peruse and walk away with timeless pieces.

Adäka embraces this moment in time as an opportunity to share stories and culture with pride and purpose to harness the spirit within and around all who are involved.

The festival hosts landmark gatherings of esteemed masters and younger artists who exchange knowledge on ancient techniques, contemporary methods and wide-ranging ideas for cultural continuity.

In 2020 and 2021, the difficult decision was made. to cancel the Festival. due to the impacts of the pandemic. This summer the Festival is back at the Kwanlin Dün Cultural Centre for its 10th year, vibrating with energy and excitement of renewal as artists gather in Whitehorse on the banks of the Yukon River. Whether you are young or moving along in years, Indigenous or not, you are welcome within our circle.


